Binc Beginnings

More than twenty years ago, a handful of passionate book lovers from Borders Group created a foundation to support each other. Today, The Book Industry Charitable (Binc) Foundation has grown to help bookstore employees and owners across the nation who encounter unexpected financial crises. The Binc Foundation works to keep book people in their homes, in their jobs, and with their families— stabilizing the independent bookstore community.

A point of particular pride: Binc is the only 501(c)(3) in the country that is dedicated exclusively to strengthening the book industry by supporting the people who work for bookstores.





Why Booksellers?

At Binc we believe that bookstores are an essential part of sustaining vibrant communities across the nation. And the good news is, this belief is reflected in an almost 27 percent increase in independent bookstore growth between 2009 and 2015, according to the American Booksellers Association. Despite the resurgence, bookstores often run on shoestring budgets, which is why many employees are just one illness, emergency room visit, car repair or missed day of work away from a financial emergency.

Bookstore employees are dedicated to feeding people knowledge—they are educated, passionate, and profoundly committed to giving customers the books best suited to their literary desires. But, in 2012 the median income for a bookstore employee was \$13,504, with a median hourly wage of \$9.27. It's a noble occupation—to guide others toward knowledge, and these couriers of literature deserve dignity. Book people sell books because they love to share their passion.

We know that many bookstores have intimate work environments where employees feel like family, and personal setbacks can have a profound effect on the business. That's why Binc is there to be a safety net in hard times, so that book people can remain as integral parts of their communities for years to come.

It was a year like no other: five devastating natural disasters meant record requests from affected booksellers. But, on the other hand, record giving meant we could meet—and even exceed—past giving. In fact, in 2017 NO BOOKSELLER IN NEED WAS TURNED AWAY. Your generosity helped booksellers and also enabled us to take a big step forward in becoming a sustainable organization. It was an extraordinary year indeed:



Eight of the top ten publishers made commitments to help booksellers.
